
香港運輸物流學會 The Hoog Kong & Kowloon Chartered Institute of Walk for Millions, 9 Jan 2011 ics & Transport

CILTHK and SCSA jointly organised a visit to Dunwell Industrial (Holdings) Ltd. to facilitate members to have a better understanding of the wastewater and used lubricating oil treatment at Hong Kong's Yuen Long Industrial Estate. Participants were given a presentation of the development and environmental technology of Dunwell Industrial (Holdings) Ltd. Then, Mr. Raymond Tse, Assistant to Managing Director of Dunwell Enviro-Tech (Holdings) Ltd., introduced the Dunwell independent waste oil treatment and disposal plant, its services and operations and used oil re-





refinery treatment system to the participants. After showing the participants around the facilities, Mr. Raymond Tse shared his business views about environmental protection in Hong Kong and his experience to minimise daily waste.

YMC Annual Dinner was successfully held on 22 October 2011





This Annual Dinner was scheduled with various joyful programmes, including interactive games



YMC Seminar: The Cathay Pacific Cargo Terminal, 28 Jun 2012

Cathay Pacific (CX) has invested HK\$5.5b in its Cathay Pacific Services Limited (CPSL), a fully owned subsidiary, to design, build and operate the CX's own cargo terminal, Cathay Pacific Cargo Terminal (CPCT) at the Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA). The new terminal will soon commence operation in early 2013. A seminar on this project was delivered by Mr. LO Sze Wai, Albert, the Commercial Manager of Cathay Pacific Services Limited (CPSL), who has over 40 years experience in air cargo operation. At the seminar, he shared his insight and experiences in the shipper and freight forwarder determining factors to airports, the journey to design and prepare CPCT, and how CPCT could be built the airlines', the shippers' and freight forwarders' preferred choice at HKIA.


YMC Annual Dinner cum Mentorship Program Apprediation Dinner 2012
